The Effects of World War 1 on Canada

World War 1 was not a positive event and killed millions of men.

However, even with these losses, positive changes occurred. For Canada, their social, political and economic situations were improved and they became more independent. They also received a national identity after their performance in the war.

After World War 1, Canada became known as more than a colony of Britain. At the battle of Vimy Ridge, they had a great success with the help and ideas of General Byng. Canada had better training, new plans, and came more prepared. This gave them an excellent victory against the Germans that the Canadians took great pride in. "...the losses were significantly fewer because of the meticulous planning and training." (Counterpoints p.32) Their win brought Canadians further in their social status and gave them a national identity as fierce fighters.

Shells, ships, planes and guns needed to be manufactured and shipped to the battles. This created many jobs for people back in Canada.
