Ways further explained:

Burying is Cheap (only buy shovels). Sus part is digging a 6 foot hole, once you've dug a hole you are in the clear. Digging a 6ft deep hole is a lot more difficult than you might expect. Burying the carcass near a body of water is not the smartest decision as it could contaminate the water and lead to some sort of investigation.

Burying a body in a graveyard is a fairly good idea. Police are not able to use sniffer dogs to their full potential (as there are other dead people). Digging and burying is the only activity needed, which can be hard. The only downside is digging a hole, and placing your victim in it, as a graveyard is usually open and a public place.

Chucking the body in water will work best if you dump them in the ocean. Get a fishing boat into the ocean. You have to weigh the body down, as it most definitely will float, spoiling your plans.

Best way to dispose of a body

Have you ever wondered what to do with a dead body? Not many people have. Devon has murdered Mr. Fitton and isn't sure what to do with his body. There are multiple ways that Devon has found to dispose of a body, but after much deliberation, he has landed on one. The best way for Devon to dispose of Mr. Fitton's body is to throw him into the Ocean because it doesn't take a lot of time, it's cheap, and the body will be unidentifiable.

Throwing a body into the ocean does not occupy a lot of Devon's time, compared to other ways of disposing of a body which also need a lot more planning. Digging a hole to fit a person in takes anywhere from 8-10 hours according to Anthony Pranger, who digs graves as a part of his daily job. All Devon will have to do is load the body into a fishing boat, strap weights onto it, and drop Fitton's body down on its journey to the bottom of the Pacific Ocean. Depending on the temperature of the ocean and the oxygen levels it can take a matter of days (higher temperature) to a matter of months (lower temperature) for the body to be unrecognizable.

Secondly, It's relatively cheap to chuck a body into the ocean. To rent a boat on Vancouver Island, it will cost Devon just 60 dollars per hour to rent a boat from Granville Island Boat Rentals. Devon needs to also purchase four twenty pound weights and a 45 plate that he will use to sink the body, which will cost him approximately 200 dollars, as the market is 2 dollars per pound. You may be thinking that 200 dollars is quite a lot to spend on disposing of a body, but there are more costly ways. Alternatively he could have fed the body to 15-20 hungry pigs, which he would either need to own and maintain a farm, which costs several thousand and takes a long time to set up, or pay a farm owner thousands to keep their mouth shut.

Lastly, throwing a body into the ocean ensures that it will be unidentifiable. Forensic scientists Gail Anderson and Lynne Bell are studying how pig carcasses decompose underwater. The study showed that amphipods cover the body and in 3-4 days the body will be eaten inside out. The crucial part of this plan is to make sure the body is below 300m deep, because that's where these creatures dwell. Other ways of disposing of bodies will be identifiable for much longer. For example, burying a body and waiting for it to decompose could take several months, depending on the conditions. Once Devon has done the hard part of throwing the body in the ocean, he just has to wait a painstaking 4 days to be sure the body can't be linked to him or his alibi.

As tragic as it is that the majestic Mr. Fitton has died, his body is a nuisance to Devon. There are several ways that Devon could dispose of a body, and they each have their pros and cons. After extensive research, Devon has found the best way to dispose of the body is to sink it in the ocean because it's quick,cheap, and doesn't link him to the crime.
