



- 1 Returning to the crime after being released from prison.
- 2 Sentences that may be served at the same time for the longest period.
- 3 A sentence that withholds a privilege for a specific period or lifetime.
- 4 A language often used by criminals or detainees in correctional institutes.
- 5 A sentence served on weekends and nights.
- 7 Brief release from custody for community service or personal reasons.
- 1 0 A judgement that is not carried out, provided requirements are met.
- 1 1 Imprisoned for a certain period.

- 1 2 The seting aside of a person's record of conviction.
- 1 4 Punishment to avenge a crime, ensuring that offenders suffer the conesquences of their actions.
- 1 5 a place for the confinement of people accused or convited of a crime.
- 1 6 A report describing the mental history of the offender.
- 2 0 A sentence that allows a person to live in the community under supervision of their patrol officer.
- 2 1 Punishment combined with treatment and training to help offender's function in society

- 6 A statement prepared by a crime victim or the victim's family describing the harm done or suffered as a result of the offence.
- 8 When a criminal is convited of multiple counts they need to serve them one after another.

- 1 3 Release of an inmate, on a promise of good behaviour, into the community before the full sentence is served.
